Duke Energy in Florida



Duke Energy provides electricity to 7.6 million retail customers in six states. The electric service area's estimated population is 24 million people. Our commercial and international businesses own and operate diverse power generation assets in North America and Latin America, including a portfolio of renewable energy assets.

Duke Energy began serving customers in Florida more than a century ago – and at the very foundation of our company is a commitment to serve our customers and communities.

- Serving Florida since 1899.
- We serve approximately 1.8 million retail accounts bringing electricity to more than 4 million people and businesses in 35 counties.
- 13,000 service territory square miles.
- Approximately 5,200 miles of transmission lines and 41,000 miles of distribution lines.
- 16 power generation sites capable of producing nearly 9,300 megawatts of electricity.
