

Asia-Pacific Overview:

Gulfstream Growth in the Region

- 2017: 331 Gulfstream aircraft in Asia Pacific
 - 285 large-cabin; 46 mid-cabin
- 2010: 142 Gulfstream aircraft in Asia Pacific
- Asia-Pacific fleet has more than doubled since 2010
- Nearly 70 Gulfstream aircraft in Southeast Asia; 23 in Singapore

All-New G500 and G600:

Best-in-class aircraft to enter service in 2018

- Enhanced performance capabilities for both aircraft
 - G500: 5,200 nm / 9,630 km at Mach 0.85*
 - G500: 4,400 nm / 8,149 km at Mach 0.90*
 - G600: 6,500 nm / 12,038 km at Mach 0.85*
 - G600: 5,100 nm / 9,445 km at Mach 0.90*
- New Gulfstream Symmetry Flight Deck™ with industry-first Active Control Sidesticks (ACS)
- Five G500 flight-test aircraft have more than 1,175 flights, accumulating more than 4,250 flight-test hours
- Five G600 flight-test aircraft have more than 360 flights, accumulating more than 1,395 flight-test hours
- G500 has reached 53,000 feet and Mach 0.995; G600 has reached 52,000 ft and Mach 0.999

G550: More than 555 G550s in service
Geneva to Singapore at Mach 0.85*

G650/: More than 275 combined aircraft in service
G650ER: More than 65 combined city-pair records
