# Atlanta

As the largest city in the South, Atlanta has always been a premier meeting, trade-show, and convention destination. But there's much more to Atlanta than meeting space. With more than 80 percent of the U.S. population within a two-hour flight, Atlanta is one of the most accessible destinations in the world. Once attendees arrive, they can hop on the Metro Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) for a 15-minute ride into the heart of Atlanta's walkable convention and entertainment district, with a variety of hotels, world-class attractions, chef-owned restaurants, and exciting nightlife just steps away.

Each neighborhood in Atlanta is packed with personality. Glitzy Midtown provides award-winning music and arts; The Westside has become a magnet for architecture and home-design enthusiasts; Buckhead blends boutiques and galleries with fabulous dining; and Little Five Points melds bohemian grunge with a thriving theater scene. But while Atlanta gleams amid glass and steel towers, the real draw is its people, who offer attendees a healthy dose of Southern hospitality. ●

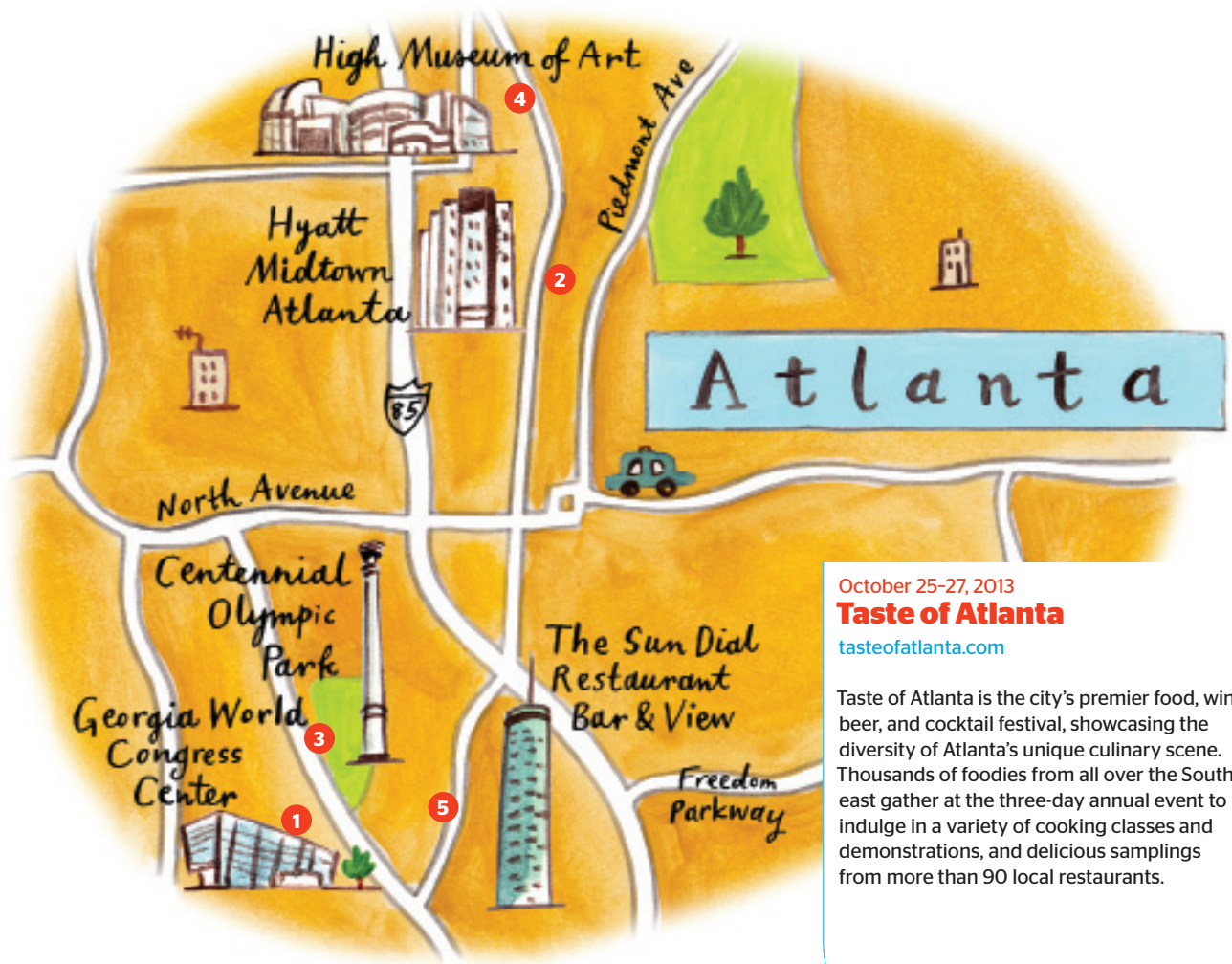
## Streetscape

Atlanta is home to more than 70 streets that include the name "Peachtree," including the well-known Peachtree Street — a lively thoroughfare linking three distinct neighborhoods: Downtown, Midtown, and Buckhead, each offering its own personality and local flavor. Style and substance take center stage in Midtown along Peachtree Street. The famed boulevard maintains a friendly feel while cutting a swath of culture from the marquee events at the Fox Theatre at one end to the Savannah College of Art and Design at the other. And in Buckhead — where shoppers can ferret out the latest trends at fashionable boutiques — Peachtree becomes Rodeo Drive with Southern charm.

## 1 Georgia World Congress Center [gwcc.com](http://gwcc.com)



Located in the heart of downtown Atlanta, the Georgia World Congress Center (GWCC) is surrounded by a number of restaurants, attractions, and more than 10,000 hotel rooms. GWCC, the fourth-largest convention center in the United States, includes 1.4 million square feet of exhibit space, 106 meeting rooms, three auditoriums, and two grand ballrooms.

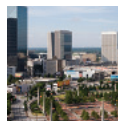
**2 Hyatt Midtown Atlanta**

Part of the Woodruff Arts Center, "The High" has 13,000 works of art in its permanent collection and regularly features exhibits never before seen in the Southeast, including "Frida & Diego: Passion, Politics, and Painting" and, currently, "Girl With a Pearl Earring: Dutch Paintings From the Mauritshuis."
