A "stately Georgian red brick" building with a six-columned white portico, the Woodlands Inn is elegant yet inviting, said Anne Chalfant in *The Philadelphia Inquirer*. The former plantation, just 25 miles northwest of Charleston, S.C., exudes the "subdued luxury of good taste and old money." Gleaming oak floors, 18th-century antiques, and a "sweeping stairway that would do Scarlett O'Hara proud" adorn the entryway. Guests spend the days walking the "woody trails," kicking back near the fireside in one of the drawing room's leather chairs, or sampling "seared Hudson Valley foie gras" in the Woodlands' five-star dining room.
