Alvin Ailey's Masterpiece *Revelations* Provides Inspiring Finale to all Programs Followed by FREE Post-performance Q & A with Dancers

(New York – November 16, 2012) Artistic Director Robert Battle and Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater invite audiences of all ages to experience the 2012 Family Matinee series - performances on Saturdays at 2pm in December that are all followed by a question-and-answer session with Ailey's acclaimed dancers. Whether watching as a child for the first time, as a parent remembering his or her childhood experience with dance, or as a family that has made Ailey a holiday tradition, all will enjoy the festive and inspiring programs.

The finale of each Family Matinee program will be Alvin Ailey's timeless masterpiece <u>Revelations</u> - one of the most well-known and respected ballets in the history of dance, acclaimed as a must-see for all and recognized by a U.S. Senate resolution. Set to a suite of traditional gospel spirituals, it will be performed with **live music on Saturday, December 15th at 2pm** and with an **expanded cast of 50 dancers** including members of Ailey II and The Ailey School **on all matinees through December 16th**. <u>Renee Robinson</u>, renowned Company member for over 30 years, will be **leading all performances of** *Revelations* during the first two weeks of the season, from November 28th until her farewell performance on December 9th.

Since its premiere in 1960, *Revelations* has been seen by more audiences around the world than any other modern work, inspiring with its perfect blend of reverent grace and spiritual elation. Springing from Ailey's childhood memories of growing up in the south and attending services at Mount Olive Baptist Church in Texas, *Revelations* pays homage to the rich cultural heritage of the African-American and explores the emotional spectrum of the human condition.

- Another Night, an innovative world premiere by rising star choreographer Kyle Abraham,
- From Before, by Tony award-winning The Lion King choreographer Garth Fagan,
- Takademe, Robert Battle's high-flying and humorous solo set to Indian Kathak rhythms,
- The Hunt, Robert Battle's explosive tour-de-force for six men that is an audience favorite,
- Arden Court, American modern dance master Paul Taylor's romantic masterpiece, Arden Court
- Night Creature, Alvin Ailey's glittering homage to jazz great Duke Ellington

ABOUT ALVIN AILEY AMERICAN DANCE THEATER

Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, recognized by U.S. Congressional resolution as a vital American "Cultural Ambassador to the World," grew from a now-fabled March 1958 performance in New York that changed forever the perception of American dance. Founded by Alvin Ailey, and guided by Judith Jamison beginning in 1989, the Company is now led by Robert Battle, whom Judith Jamison chose to succeed her on July 1, 2011. Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater has performed for an estimated 23 million people in 71 countries on 6 continents, promoting the uniqueness of the African-American cultural experience and the preservation and enrichment of the American modern dance tradition. In addition to being the Principal Dance Company of New York City Center, where its performances have become a year-end tradition, the Ailey company performs annually at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC, the Auditorium Theatre in Chicago, the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts of Miami-Dade County in Miami, The Fox Theatre in Atlanta, Zellerbach Hall in Berkeley, CA and at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center in Newark where it is the Principal Resident Affiliate), and appears frequently in other major theaters throughout the United States and the world during extensive yearly tours. The Ailey organization also includes Ailey II (1974), a second performing company of emerging young dancers and innovative choreographers; The Ailey School (1969), one of the most extensive dance training programs in the world; Ailey Arts in Education & Community Programs, which brings dance into the classrooms, communities and lives of people of all ages; and The Ailey Extension (2005), a program offering dance and fitness classes to the general public, which began with the opening of Ailey's permanent home—the largest building dedicated to dance in New York City, the dance capital of the world —named The Joan Weill Center for Dance, at 55th Street at 9th Avenue in New York City.
