Acclaimed Italian choreographer Mauro Bigonzetti brings his highly dramatic style, complex partnering and seamless integration of classical and modern techniques to the Ailey repertory **in his first work for an American modern dance company.** Bigonzetti explains, "I discovered choreography when I met Alvin" as a young dancer with Aterballeto performing classic Ailey works such as *Escapades, Night Creature*, and *The River*.

Originally from Rome, Bigonzetti studied dance at the Teatro dell'Opera (Rome Opera House). In 1982 he joined the modern dance company Aterballetto, located in Reggio Emilia, and performed with them for ten years. Bigonzetti left Aterballetto to pursue choreographic endeavors, and was asked to return shortly after to choreograph and become the artistic director. Since then, Bigonzetti has created exceptional works for the New York City Ballet, Ballet Teatro Argentina and the English National Ballet. He was named "one of the outstanding choreographers of the 21st century," by France's *Le Figaro*.

Praised for his fresh and inventive sensibility, Bigonzetti's ballet was inspired by the aesthetic beauty of Baroque art. The work's creation process included Mr. Bigonzetti getting to know the Ailey dancers' unique personalities and movement styles. *Festa Barocca* tells the story of a festive party, and Bigonzetti was so inspired by the Ailey dancers' emotional intensity and technical prowess, he cast the entire company in this piece – a rare and special occurrence.
